PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION

Certification in the medical field is very valuable. It forms the basis of the acknowledgment of your expertise and provides verification of your proficiency. Although it is possible to work in this medical profession at entry-level positions without certification, certifications furnish the evidence that you have accomplished an understanding of your profession area.

The AAPC (American Association of Professional Coders) and AHIMA (American Health Information Management Association) offer certification examinations in physician office coding. These certifications are recognized throughout the healthcare industry and across the country regardless of how you obtained your training.

Neosho County Community College's program will assist you in preparation for these certification examinations.

Program Overview

This internet program includes six courses:

- Medical Terminology
- Medical Assisting I (front medical office)
- Introduction to Medical Coding
- Advanced Medical Coding
- Human Body in Health & Disease
- National Coding Exam Review

Students with prior medical experience may choose to complete a selected course or courses as continuing education and/or preparation for national coding examinations.



Program Overview

This internet program includes six courses that are completed within three semesters.
