

Allied Health Care Courses

NCCC offers the courses needed for the Allied Health profession.

Course Descriptions of Allied Health Care courses:

Nurse Aide – This 6-credit-hour course is designed for individuals seeking an entry-level position in the area of adult health care. Release forms and immunization records are required. A current “negative” TB test is also required. At the conclusion of the training course, students will complete a state examination. (90 clock hours) *This course is a prerequisite for the Nursing and Medical Assistant programs.*

Medication Aide – This 5-credit-hour course trains students to safely administer medications. Students must be a Certified Nurse Aide prior to enrolling in the Medication Aide course. Reading level will be assessed prior to acceptance into this course. At the completion of the course, students will take the state examination. (75 clock hours)

Medication Aide Update – This 1-credit-hour course is a continuing education course for all certified medication aides. Continued certification is provided by taking this course. (13 clock hours)

Operator Trainer – This 2-credit-hour course teaches Kansas Licensure regulations, operations of care facilities, proper completion of forms, and information on abuse, neglect and exploitation. This course is mandated for operators of assisted living facilities, residential health care facilities, home plus, and adult day care facilities. Certification is part of the course.

Home Health Aide – This 2-credit-hour course teaches care within a home setting including safety and personal care required of each client. The State examination is part of the class. (20 clock hours)

CPR – This .5 to 3-credit-hour course trains students in first aid for choking as well as in cardiopulmonary resuscitation for adults, infants and children. Certificates in CPR may be earned.

First Responder – This 3-credit-hour course teaches skills in providing basic emergency medical care to victims of emergencies, and take any actions necessary to minimize patient suffering and prevent further injury until EMT's or MICT's arrive. Students may take the State exam upon completion of the course. The exam is not included in the course.

Emergency Medical Technician-Basic – This 12-credit-hour course is designed for the person interested in providing medical care to patients in the pre-hospital setting. Students must be 18 years of age to take this course and will take the State board exam at the completion of the course. Students must successfully complete the course before applying to take the State examination. The State exam is not included in the class.

Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate – This 5-credit-hour course is designed for individuals interested in providing intermediate level care to patients in the pre-hospital setting. The course will provide the participant with opportunities to gain information, skills, and attitudes necessary to apply to take the certification examination. The State exam is not included in the class.
