INTERINSTITUTIONAL MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

MidAmerica Nazarene University (MNU) and Neosho County Community College (NCCC) desire to enter into this agreement for the purpose of allowing MNU to offer nursing education programs including but not limited to the "RN-BSN" program onsite at the NCCC Campus at Ottawa, KS. The agreement shall be for the period January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014, and will renew automatically unless any element becomes untenable for either party subject to the following:

- (1) The end date shall be the end of any calendar year in which the agreement becomes untenable for either party.
- (2) There shall be timely notification, at least ninety (90) days in advance of the end date, by the party seeking to end the agreement to the other party.

This agreement describes a facilities use agreement between NCCC and MNU. The RN-BSN program (See APPENDICES A & B) from MNU is proposed as the first offering for the Ottawa campus of NCCC. A second program offering to be negotiated at a later time but within the context of this agreement could be the one-year accelerated MSN program. Other MNU programs may be included within the context of this agreement subject to similar negotiation between NCCC and MNU. The following elements form the basis for this agreement.

What MNU will provide:

- (1) Seamless Upward Mobility in Nursing Education. An opportunity for Neosho County Community College graduates to bridge from the Associate Degree to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree in one calendar year.
- (2) Tuition Discount. MNU will give ten (10) percent (See APPENDIX C) discounted tuition for NCCC students graduating with their two-year degree after 12/1/2011.
- (3) February 2012 Start Date. Classes in the RN-BSN program will be scheduled to start in February of 2012, or as soon thereafter as is mutually agreeable.
- (4) MNU will begin recruitment efforts as soon as all formal arrangements are negotiated.

What NCCC will provide:

- (1) Classroom Space. RN-BSN classes will be held on Wednesday. MNU is proposing to offer one 4-hour class in the morning and another 4-hour class in the afternoon (one evening class may be offered if that is needed by the students). Assignment of classroom space will be at sole discretion of NCCC.
- (2) Faculty/staff Office. NCCC will provide one office to be used by MNU instructors, faculty advisors and admissions staff.
- (3) Minimal Laboratory Space. MNU will have non-exclusive access to a private room/bed in a laboratory setting for the needed health assessment return demonstration.
- (4) Student Services. The students enrolled in the RN-BSN program will have full access to public areas at NCCC including the learning center, bookstore, and lounge.
- (5) Non-NCCC students. MNU will be allowed to recruit students for the RN-BSN and other programs from the community when space is available in classes. NCCC graduates will always have absolute priority in classes taught on the Ottawa campus.

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
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MISCELLANEOUS


- (1) Insurance. Upon request, parties shall provide each other with written documentation of insurance, including insurance for their respective employees and institutional liability insurance. NCCC shall not be liable for any loss or damage to any MNU personal property at NCCC regardless of the cause of such loss or damage.
- (2) Employment. Faculty and staff of MNU are not employees of NCCC. NCCC shall not be responsible for any employment taxes, withholding, or provision of any other benefit to employees of MNU. Upon request, MNU will provide NCCC with name, title, and job description of any MNU employee physically present on the NCCC campus.
- (3) Students. Upon request, MNU will provide NCCC with directory information for students attending MNU classes at NCCC. NCCC will not receive nor be responsible for identifiable student records of MNU students pertaining to MNU courses. MNU students will be required to abide by the NCCC code of student conduct and discipline while attending MNU classes at NCCC.
- (4) Indemnification. MNU agrees to indemnify and hold NCCC harmless from any claims of any kind or nature and any resulting expenses, including attorneys fees arising out of or incidental to Nursing classes at NCCC except to the extent that any claim, demand, liability, action, suit, or proceeding is the result of an act or omission on the part of NCCC.







**Transitioning from Neosho County Community College to
MidAmerica Nazarene University's RN to BSN Program**

MNU General Education Requirements:

- General Psychology (3)
- Intermediate Algebra (3)
- Statistics (3)
 - May opt to take Probability & Statistics through the MNU Nursing Department.
- English Comp 1 (3)
- English Comp 2 (3)
 - May opt to take Research Writing for Healthcare through the MNU Nursing Department.
- Public Speaking or Communication Elective (3)
 - May opt to take Effective Communication in Healthcare through the MNU Nursing Department.
- History or Sociology Elective (3)
- Microbiology or Chemistry (4)

Other Admission Requirements:

- Students must have completed an Associate Degree of Nursing.
- Registered nurse with current unencumbered RN license in the United States.
- Cumulative GPA must be 2.5 or higher (in original pre-licensure program) for admission to the RN to BSN program with no more than 12 credit hours of outstanding General Education courses remaining.
- Cumulative GPA must be 3.0 or higher for admission (in original pre-licensure program) to the RN to MSN program with no more than 3 credit hours of outstanding General Education courses remaining.

Recommended NCCC courses which have been approved for transfer into MNU's RN to BSN program:

- Pathophysiology
 - NURS 230 Pathophysiology
- Pharmacology
 - NURS 122 Pharmacology for Nursing
- Health Assessment
 - NUR 113 Nursing Assessment

Note: Students seeking an associate's degree from NCCC should consult with an Academic Advisor from NCCC to ensure their degree requirements are being met.
